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Continued Derbyshire CC Framework success



Following the recent successful completion of a new primary school at Clay Cross, which included a full suite of building services and specialist systems for Framework partners Miller Construction and Derbyshire County Council, the PWP team is now progressing with the design and construction of a specialist care centre in Staveley.

The £1.4m Mechanical, Electrical and Specialist Services Design and Build package is being tailored to meet the needs of those suffering from dementia. The lighting

design in particular follows the recommendations of Stirling University's "Designing Lighting For People With Dementia" guidelines, and the project also includes specialist call and monitoring systems.

The design incorporates under-floor heating, full kitchen services and environmentally friendly and energy saving enhancements such as rainwater harvesting, a micro CHP unit linked to an air sourced heat pump and photovoltaic installation.



New five-year contract for Maintenance Division

PWP Maintenance Division has secured a five-year, round-the-clock, preventative maintenance contract for the full suite of Mechanical, Electrical and Specialist services for a new 40,000ft² high tech Public Sector facility. The shell and fit out building services were designed and installed by PWP under a £2.2m D & B contract.
